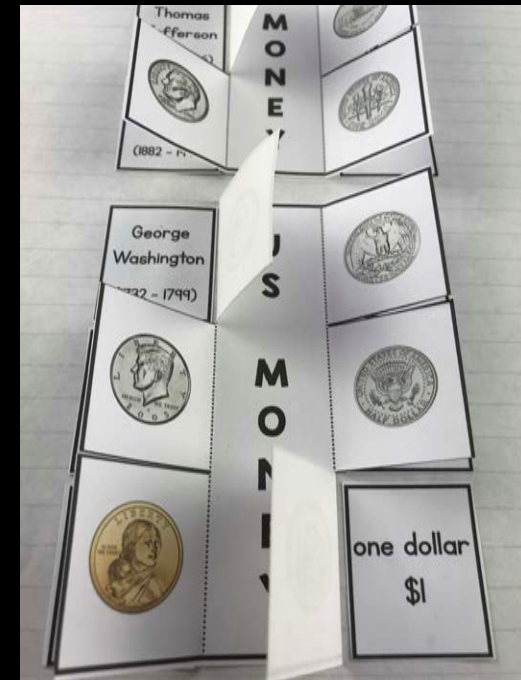
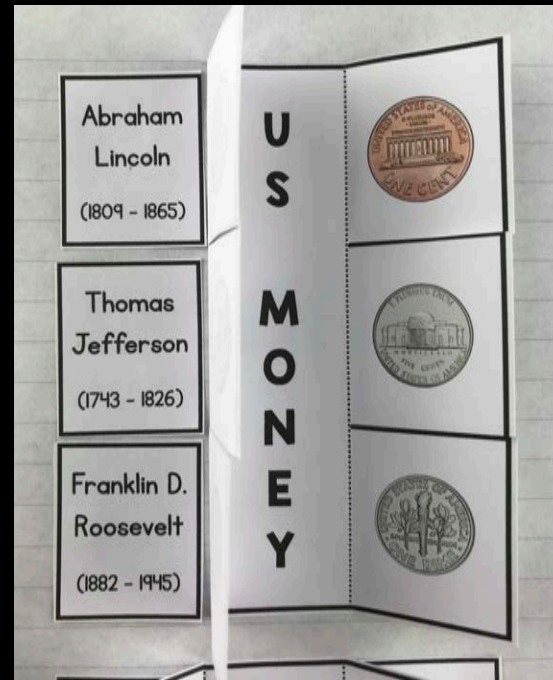
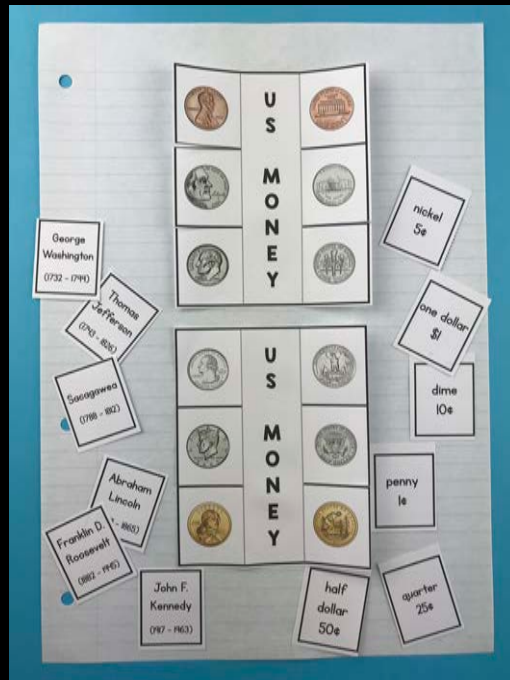

**On the obverse**

The portrait of the first president of the USA, George Washington, is on the obverse of the \$1 bill.



**The Treasury Department Seal**

A balanced scale: it represents justice

A chevron with 13 stars: they represent the thirteen original colonies

A key symbolizing authority and trust

Paper money is printed in 12 Federal Reserve Banks and you know where exactly by looking at the letter in the Federal Reserve Seal

A: Boston	B: New York	C: Philadelphia	D: Cleveland
E: Richmond	F: Atlanta	G: Chicago	H: St. Louis

**On the reverse** is the Great Seal became the USA's official symbol of sovereignty in 1782.

The reverse of the Great Seal features an unfinished pyramid, meaning that the country can still expand. The pyramid is also a symbol of strength and duration.

The eye of providence is in a triangle. Above it is a Latin phrase: *ANNUIT COEPTIS*, meaning "God has favored our undertakings". He favors the prosperity of the USA. There are 13 letters in this phrase.

13 layers leading to the top

MDCCLXXVI = 1776, American independence from Britain.

A banner at the bottom of the pyramid: *NOVUS ORDO SECLORUM* means new order of the ages, referring to the founding of the USA.

13 stars above the eagle, for the 13 original colonies

The American bald eagle is pictured with the shield, 13 stripes. The bar at the top represents Congress.


*"E PLURIBUS UNUM"* is the traditional motto. There are 13 letters in it.

an olive branch, with 13 leaves and 13 olives

13 arrows: symbol of war
