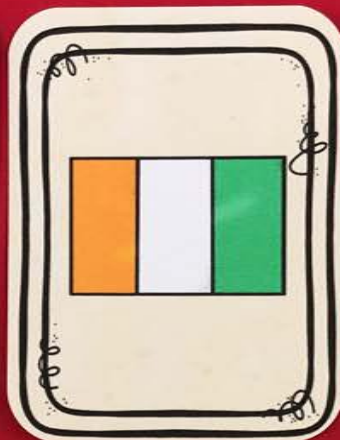

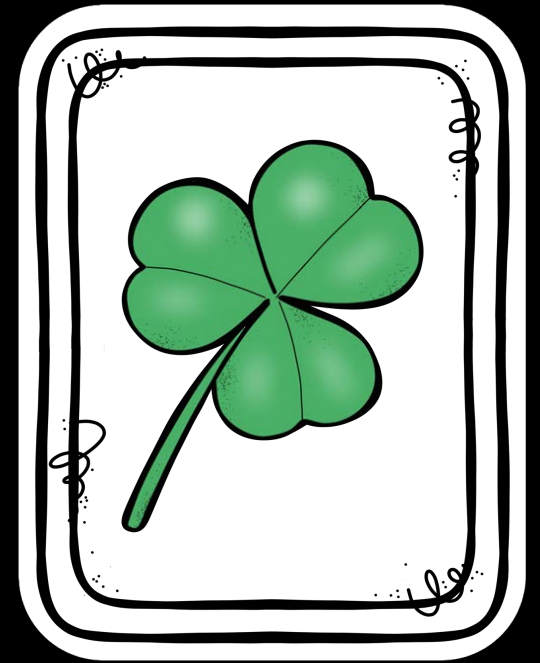
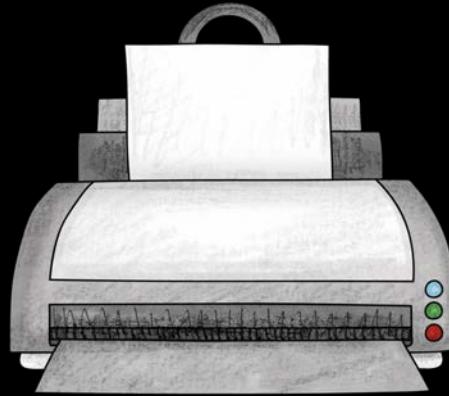

How to use this resource

Basic Rules of Memory



- Shuffle all the cards.
- Lay them face down in rows.
- The first player chooses 2 cards to reveal. If they match he keeps them and can play again.
- If they do not match, he puts them back face down. The next player proceeds the same way.
- The game is over when there is no card left.
- The player who found the most pairs is the winner.

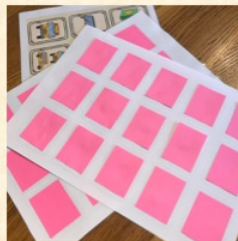
To add some teaching value to the game you may want to write words on the cards they picked. Note that this game can also be played with pictures.

How to print and prepare this resource

It **takes time** to prepare a set of cards. I would say about an hour, from start to finish.

Step 1: Cut a piece of cardboard. I cut mine 6cm x 4.5cm (that's about 2.4 x 1.8) and it works fine for me. You might need to adjust your dimensions though.



Step 2: Print the pages you need for your game. Stick the pieces of cardboard at the back of each card and laminate.
